SCC Winter Teams Win Five State Titles

373

Since the league's inception in 1994-95, SCC member schools have now won 373 state championships.

Once again, SCC member-schools fared extremely well in state tournament competition. During the 2013-14 winter season, SCC teams won five state championships with another nine teams earning runner-up status.

68 %: Sixty-eight percent of SCC teams qualified for the state tournaments in the following sports: boys ice hockey (15-of-16), boys basketball (13-of-20), girls basketball (12-of-19) and girls ice hockey (5-of-11).
