Diversity “Dream Teams” - Breaking Barriers, Building Bridges

Under the direction of retired Branford assistant principal (and current CAS-CIAC administrator) Dave Maloney and in partnership with the Anti-Defamation League, the SCC Diversity Dream Teams – Breaking Barriers, Building Bridges – had another successful year... Over 125 students representing the 22 member schools participated in the yearlong program.

SCC Year in Review

State Championships

22 state titles third-most in league history

It was another successful year as SCC member-schools fared extremely well in league and statewide competition. All told, SCC teams captured 22 state championships (6 fall, 8 winter, 8 spring) during the 2010-11 academic year. The record for the most state titles in a single year is 25, set in 1996-97. Twenty-four additional teams (7 fall, 13 winter, 4 spring) earned runner-up status in CIAC state competition. Since the league's inception in 1994, SCC schools have won 324 state championships. Cheshire has won the most state championships (55) followed by Hillhouse (47), Amity (31) and Guilford/Fairfield Prep (24).

SCC Factoids

Some noteworthy items by SCC student-athletes and teams during 2010-11

RIVALS MEET: Long-time rivals and shoreline neighbors Hand and Guilford met in a SCC championship game three times in 2010-11 (field hockey, boys soccer and Division II ice hockey). The Tigers won all three games.

IF YOU CAN DO IT, SO CAN WE: The Guilford boys and girls cross country teams won the SCC and Class MM titles this past fall, while the Hillhouse boys (Class MM) and girls (Class M) outdoor track & field teams both captured state titles.

POINTS, POINTS AND MORE POINTS: Jonathan Law defeated Guilford, 67-53, in a football game on November 5 -- it was the highest-scoring game in league and modern-day state history.

"MORE" IF YOU CAN DO IT, SO CAN WE: The Career boys (Class M) and girls basketball teams (Class LL) each made their respective state championship games. It was the second straight year this happened for a SCC school (Hillhouse in 2010 -- boys in Class LL; girls in Class L). For the second time in the last three years, both the Hillhouse boys and girls basketball teams captured SCC titles. The Amity boys and girls tennis squads also both won SCC titles.

GRAPPLING: The Xavier wrestling team won the Class LL state title -- it was the first state championship by a SCC team since 2002 (Derby, Class S).

FIRST THINGS FIRST: The Hand girls tennis team won the Class M state title... It was the first state title won by a SCC team in the sport of girls tennis. The Hand girls lacrosse team also reached its first state championship game in 2011 -- and it was just the second state title game berth for a SCC girls lacrosse team.

JUST A FROSH: Foran freshman tennis star **Bradley Orban** won the Class M singles title. Bradley also reached the State Open finals before falling to Staples' Daniel Hirschberg.

PERFECT: The Cheshire boys volleyball squad, which won the SCC and Class L state titles, finished the season with a perfect 22-0 record. It was the SCC's first state title in boys volleyball since 2005 (Shelton).

PAT'S THE BEST: Shelton senior **Patrick Gillen** wrestled for the 215-pound national high school title on April 3 in Virginia Beach, Va. Gillen fell to New York's Nick Gwiadowski in a fall at 4:57 -- it was Gillen's first loss of the season in 54 bouts. Gillen was just the third wrestler from the state of Connecticut to compete for a national title. Gillen finished his high school career with a 204-15 career record and his 204 wins make him the state's all-time winningest wrestler. Gillen was a four-time All-SCC wrestler -- just the third wrestler in league history to win four SCC titles.

SIX STRAIGHT FOR SCC: Notre Dame won the Class L state baseball title -- it was the sixth straight year a SCC team has won the championship.

FAMILY TIES: A brother-sister combo -- Notre Dame's **Gary Flowers** (Class L baseball) and Sacred Heart Academy's **Molly Flowers** (Class M softball) -- both pitched their teams to state titles on June 10.

SCC SWEEP: Amity's **David Karabinos** (decathlon) and Lyman Hall's **Ronea Saunders** (heptathlon) were both victorious at the annual state-wide track & field competition, held on June 14-15.

SCC Year in Review

Xavier Named “Kelly Award” Winner by Walter Camp Foundation

Xavier, the 2010 Class LL state champion and #1 football team in the state, was the recipient of the “Kelly Award” by the Walter Camp Football Foundation. It is the second time that Xavier earned the Kelly Award (2005). It also marked the eighth time – and second straight year – since 1994 that a SCC school captured the honor (Cheshire 1994, 1995; Hand 1997, 2004; West Haven 2002; Notre Dame 2001 and 2009).

SCC Adds Girls Ice Hockey

The SCC will add girls ice hockey to its list of offerings starting in 2011-12. Girls ice hockey is not a CIAC-sanctioned sport, but the sport has grown substantially in the last decade. It will be the 27th sport offered by the conference. Teams in the former Central Connecticut Girls Hockey League (CCGHL) will all compete in the SCC, including league schools Hamden, Daniel Hand, Guilford, West Haven, Branford and the North Haven/Amity co-op. In addition, Simsbury, West Hartford co-op of Hall/Conard, Notre Dame of Fairfield and Lauralton Hall will be allowed to compete in the SCC next year.

SCC in Ice Hockey Heaven

Once again, the SCC cemented its dominance in the sport of ice hockey. Fairfield Prep, the 2011 Division I state champions, finished as the top-ranked team in the season-ending *New Haven Register* and *Hartford Courant* ice hockey polls. The Jesuits (21-3) were one of eight SCC teams, including Division II state champion Cheshire (16-6-2), who were ranked or received votes in either poll. Hamden, who lost to Fairfield Prep in the Division I quarterfinals, was ranked second in the Courant poll and fifth in the Register. Xavier (14-8) and Notre Dame (12-8) were each ranked in the top ten in both polls, while SCC and Division II runner-up Guilford (20-4-1), West Haven (12-7-2) and SCC Division II playoff champion Daniel Hand (12-11-1) also received votes.

As Easy as 1-2-3

Hillhouse, Career, Mercy are state’s top three girls basketball teams

SCC and three-time defending Class L state champion Hillhouse (25-2) finished as the top-ranked team in the season-ending *New Haven Register* and *Hartford Courant* girls basketball polls. Class LL state champion Career (22-5) and SCC and Class LL runner-up Mercy (24-3) finished second and third, respectively. It is the first time that the SCC had the top three teams in the season-ending polls.

Hillhouse Track Star Earns National Recognition

Precious Holmes Earns Gatorade State Honors

Hillhouse sophomore outdoor track standout **Precious Holmes** was named as the Gatorade Connecticut Girls Track & Field Athlete of the Year. She is the second Hillhouse student-athlete – joining former Academic Shaniqua Burgess (2006-07) – to earn the honor. Precious captured three individual state championships (100, 200 and 400 meters) this spring and led the Academics to the SCC, Class M and State Open titles. At the New England championships, Holmes placed first in the 100 (12.29) and 400-meter (55.420 dashes. At the New Balance Outdoor Nationals, she ran the third leg of the second-place sprint medley relay quartet that finished in 3:59.87, and she placed second in the 400-meter dash in 53.26.

Esposito and Gillen Named Athletes of the Year

Congratulations to Foran senior volleyball/softball star **Sage Esposito** and Shelton wrestling and lacrosse standout **Patrick Gillen** for being named the *New Haven Register*’s 2010-11 Athletes of the Year. Sage will play volleyball at the University of Connecticut, while Patrick will continue his wrestling career at the University of Virginia. Sage and Patrick represent the 19th and 20th student athletes – since 1996-97 – from the SCC to earn this prestigious honor. It is also the eighth time both recipients came from the SCC.

SCC Hockey Slapshots

- 2011 marked the eighth consecutive season the SCC had a state champion.
- In 17 seasons, SCC teams have won 22 state titles (13 in Division I, 7 in Division II and 2 in Division III).
- With two state titles, it marked the fourth consecutive year the SCC has won multiple state titles.
- A SCC school has won the Division I title five straight years (2007-2011), while the Division II crown has been captured by a SCC team for four consecutive years.

SCC Year in Review

Season-by-Season CIAC Playoff Recap

In 2010-2011, sixty-seven percent (138-of-206) of SCC teams qualified for CIAC state tournament competition in sports requiring a qualification (wins or winning percentage) for admission.

Fall (42-of-67), 63%

Sixty-three percent of SCC teams qualified for CIAC fall team sport playoff competition in girls soccer (10-of-18), boys soccer (14-of-19), girls volleyball (11-of-19), and field hockey (7-of-11). In addition, a league-record six football teams (out of 19) earned state playoff berths.

Winter (38-of-54), 70%

Seventy percent of SCC teams qualified for CIAC winter team sport playoff competition in boys basketball (14-of-20), girls basketball (13-of-19), and ice hockey (11-of-15).

Spring (58-of-85), 68%

Sixty-eight percent of SCC teams qualified for CIAC spring team sport playoff competition in baseball (14-of-20), softball (14-of-19), boys lacrosse (9-of-13), girls lacrosse (7-of-11), boys volleyball (4-of-5) and girls tennis (10-of-17).

CT Orthopaedic Awards "Comeback Player" Scholarships

Two senior student athletes – **Katie Winkle** (*Sacred Heart Academy*) and **Jack Singleton** (*Guilford HS*) – were the initial recipients of the Connecticut Orthopaedic Specialists' "Comeback Player of the Year" scholarship award. A SCC corporate sponsor, COS offered a \$1,000 scholarship for one male and one female athlete who participated in an interscholastic sport during the 2010/2011 season, and showed great leadership both on and off the field after their severe injury.

A standout softball player, Katie Winkle was diagnosed with Acute Myelogenous Leukemia in the June of 2006 and has battled the disease ever since. She had chemotherapy and AVN (Avascular Necrosis) in her shoulder and needed surgery to restore circulation. Her perseverance and enthusiasm allowed her to return to the Pacers' softball squad (and led them to a state championship!) and was a standout player who earned SCC All-Quinnipiac Division honors in each of the last two years. A high honor student with a 4.11 GPA, Katie, who is a resident of Orange, will attend Quinnipiac University.

Jack Singleton, Guilford – football

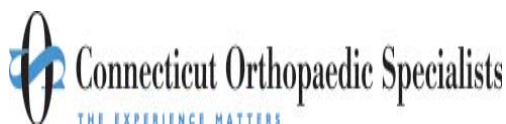
