State Championships

It was another successful year as SCC member-schools fared extremely well in league and statewide competition. All told, SCC teams captured 16 state championships (5 fall, 6 winter, 5 spring) during the 2012-13 academic year. Nineteen additional teams (5 fall, 7 winter, 7 spring) earned runner-up status in CIAC state competition.

Worth Noting: Nine different SCC schools won state titles in 2012-13 with Hillhouse and Daniel Hand each capturing the most with four state titles... Fairfield Prep won two state titles.

More State Championship Facts

Since the league's inception in 1994, SCC schools have won 365 state championships. In those 19 years, Cheshire has won the most state championships (57) followed by Hillhouse (55), Amity (33), Fairfield Prep (32) and Daniel Hand (30).

History of Success

In 2012-13, five SCC teams finished as the #1 team in their respective sports' season-ending media or coaches polls. That brings the total to 17 in the last three years.

Season-by-Season State Playoff Recap

In 2012-2013, sixty-seven percent (138-of-206) of SCC teams qualified for CIAC state tournament competition in sports requiring a qualification (wins or winning percentage) for admission.

FALL (44-of-66), 67%

Sixty-seven percent of SCC teams qualified for CIAC fall team sport playoff competition in girls soccer (13-of-17), boys soccer (13-of-19), girls volleyball (11-of-19), and field hockey (7-of-11). In addition, four football teams (out of 19) earned state playoff berths.

WINTER (47-of-65), 72%

Seventy two percent of SCC teams qualified for CIAC winter team sport playoff competition in boys basketball (15-of-20), girls basketball (15-of-19), boys ice hockey (13-of-16) and girls ice hockey (4-of-10).

SPRING (54-of-84), 64%

Sixty-four percent of SCC teams qualified for CIAC spring team sport playoff competition in baseball (15-of-19), softball (12-of-19), boys lacrosse (9-of-13), girls lacrosse (7-of-11), boys volleyball (3-of-5) and girls tennis (8-of-17).

Daniel Hand Wins Walter Camp "Kelly Award"

Daniel Hand, the 2012 Class L state champion and consensus #1 football team in the state, was the recipient of the "Kelly Award" by the Walter Camp Football Foundation. It is the third time that Daniel Hand (13-0) earned the Kelly Award (1997 and 2004). It also marked the 10th time – and fourth straight year – that a SCC school captured the honor (Cheshire 1994, 1995; Xavier, 2005, 2010 and 2011; West Haven 2002; Notre Dame 2001 and 2009).

SCC Partners With FCIAC for Football

In late November, the SCC and the Fairfield County Interscholastic Athletic Conference (FCIAC) announced an unprecedented two-year football scheduling partnership. The leagues have scheduled 24 football games in each of the next two seasons (2013 and 2014). With the 2013 and 2014 seasons each having an extra week (i.e., an 11th game) on the schedule, the SCC and FCIAC will have 17 head-to-head contests in the first week in both years (competing teams will alternate home and away). In addition, seven additional SCC-FCIAC games will be played in each of the next two seasons. Since both leagues have an odd number of teams playing football, teams in each league have "open weeks" in their schedules. As a result, the leagues were able to match up seven games.

Athletics Highlights

SCC/SWC Merge in Boys Ice Hockey

In May, the SCC and South-West Conference announced a merger for their boys ice hockey conferences, starting in 2013-14. The SCC/SWC Boys Ice Hockey league will consist of 25 teams (16 from the SCC and nine from SWC) in three divisions. Teams will play one regular-season "counting" game within their division. In addition, the leagues will host postseason competitions in all three divisions. There will be 4-team playoffs in divisions II and III (March 6 and 8, 2014), and a championship game in Division I (March 7, 2014). Playoff sites and times will be determined at a later date.

Anderson and Holmes Named Athletes of the Year

Hillhouse seniors – **Andre Anderson** and **Precious Holmes** – were named the *New Haven Register's* 2012–13 Athletes of the Year. Anderson, a two-sport All-Area and All-State honoree, led the Academics to state titles in football and basketball. He will play football at the University of New Haven. Holmes was a record-breaking All-American indoor track standout who led the Academics to the SCC and Class M state titles. She will run at the University of South Carolina. Andre and Precious represent the 23rd and 24th student athletes – since 1996-97 – from the SCC to earn this prestigious honor. It is also the tenth time both recipients came from the SCC.

- Dubbed the "Game of the Century," Daniel Hand beats Xavier in a battle of SCC football unbeaten, 40-20, on Oct. 12 in Middletown.
- Sixth-seeded Branford girls soccer team captures its first ever SCC title with a 1-0 overtime victory over Shelton on Nov. 6.
- Amity swimmer Dana Grindall completes a fabulous scholastic career earning All-America honors.
- SCC announces two-year football scheduling partnership with FCIAC for 2013 and 2014 seasons.
- SCC boys soccer champion Fairfield Prep reaches the Class LL state title game for first time; and become the first SCC team to reach a state title game in 12 years.
- Three football teams (Hand, Xavier, Hillhouse) capture state titles at Rentschler Field. It is most state titles since 2005 for the SCC.
- The state's top two boys basketball teams - Hillhouse and Fairfield Prep - play four times, including the SCC and Class LL title games. Hillhouse wins the both titles and earns state's #1 ranking.
- SCC hosts Division I/II Ice Hockey Championship Game doubleheader at Quinnipiac's High Point Solutions Arena on February 27. Daniel Hand (II) and Fairfield Prep (I) capture league titles. It is also the first Division I playoff game in 14 years.
- Fairfield Prep (24-1) captures the Division I state ice hockey title with a 3-2 win over SCC-rival Notre Dame on March 19. The Jesuits finish a perfect 20-0 against state competition.
- The Hillhouse girls indoor track squad won its third consecutive SCC and Class M state titles, both in convincing fashion.
- Hillhouse's Precious Holmes runs her way to All-American status in indoor track after winning the 400 meter national title.
- Xavier wrestler Elliott Antler captured the SCC, Class LL, State Open and New England titles in the 170-pound weight class.
- Kellie Davis (Hillhouse) and Chris Alvarado (Fairfield Prep) are the Most Outstanding Performers at all three league running championship events (cross country, indoor and outdoor track) in 2012-13.
- SCC and South-West Conference announce an ice hockey merger that will include 25 teams in three separate divisions and postseason competition.
- Daniel Hand boys and girls win the SCC Division I tennis titles with hard-fought victories over Amity on May 22 at Yale University.
- Foran's Bradley Orban wins his second straight boys tennis State Open singles title on June.
- Amity's baseball team captures Class LL baseball title behind the arm of Mike Concato, who allows just two hits in 21 innings during the entire state tournament.
- SCC champion Fairfield Prep, who was a perfect 17-0 versus state competition, won the Class LL boys lacrosse title with a 14-8 victory over Staples on June 8. It was the top-ranked Jesuits' sixth state title in last eight years.
- Amity's David Karabinos and Alexa Eldracher win the state decathlon/heptathlon, respectively. Karabinos won for the third straight year and Eldracher for the second consecutive time.

Both students overcame severe injuries during their high school careers, yet were able to overcome them to become outstanding role models in their respective schools.

(COS) has offered a Comeback Player of the Year Scholarship for one male and one female athlete who participated in an interscholastic sport during the 2012-2013 season, and showed great leadership both on and off the field after their severe injury.



Coaches and school's athletic directors nominated these student-athletes after they each suffered an unfortunate injury that prohibited them from play during their high school careers. Isabelle and Noah each received a \$1,000 scholarship to be used for their college education.

"This is our third year in awarding student-athletes from the SCC with scholarships," explained Glenn Elia, Chief Executive Officer of COS. "Our goal has been to acknowledge two athletes that have overcome the challenges of an injury and, through hard work and determination, have become positive role models for their fellow teammates. We know there are scholarships for gifted athletes. This

one is for their impeccable character displayed both on and off the field."

"Many thanks to the doctors and staff at Connecticut Orthopaedic Specialists for their support of the SCC and this scholarship," explained SCC Commissioner Al Carbone. "Our league has many outstanding student-athletes who excel in the classroom and on the field, but we are delighted that two exceptional young people in Isabelle Fishbein-Ouimette and Noah Criscuolo can be recognized for their admirable stories of perseverance and unselfishness."

Isabelle Fishbein-Ouimette, Lyman Hall – soccer

Isabelle is a member of the Lady Trojans soccer squad. Last summer, Isabelle's doctors found an ovarian tumor, weighing two pounds, and successfully removed it. Isabelle had a remarkably short recovery, but found her return to the team and to her previous fitness level to be a challenge. Nevertheless, she persisted and her inspiration and leadership was a positive impact to her teammates and squad, earning several team awards for her inspired play.

Lyman Hall girls soccer head coach Charles Liu said, "Isabelle is a very special lady, an athlete determined not to let her school and team down. I don't know of a more deserving player who has had a very positive impact on the team, especially from an injury that she should have missed and not played."

Isabelle will attend the University of Ottawa and is interested in studying environmental science.

Noah Criscuolo, Guilford – wrestling

In the summer following his sophomore year, Noah suffered multiple injuries, including a compound fracture of his femur and collapsed lung, in an automobile accident. During his recovery, he suffered from failed bone growth and endured multiple operations which caused him to be unable to wrestle his junior year.

Despite these obstacles, Noah persevered and returned to the team and was named a captain. He had an outstanding 2012-13 season, finishing with a 29-5 record and placed sixth at the Class M state tournament. He also earned Second Team All-SCC honors and was an Academic All-State selection. He finished his scholastic career with 97 victories.

Guilford wrestling head coach Craig Vedrani said, "Despite being unable to wrestle and while going through intense rehab sessions and encountering setbacks along the way, Noah maintained his passion and enthusiasm for his team and his own recovery. He remained focused on his mission to get healthy and returned to the mat."

Noah will attend the University of Rhode Island and study nursing.
