### **Diversity "Dream Teams" - Breaking Barriers, Building Bridges**

Under the direction of retired Branford assistant principal (and current CAS-CIAC administrator) Dave Maloney and in partnership with the Anti-Defamation League, the SCC Diversity Dream Teams - Breaking Barriers, Building Bridges – had another successful year... The program held its final session of the 2008-09 academic year on May 15 at the Jewish Community Center in Woodbridge... Over 125 students representing the 23 member schools participated in the yearlong program and helped produce the 2008-09 Annual Report - a thoughtful and compelling compilation of our schools' and students' works.

### **Five Named Governors' Scholars**

Five students from SCC member schools were recently recognized as Governor's Scholars... Congratulations to Katherine Han (Cheshire), Dakota Spear (Amity Regional), Jacob Stern (Guilford), Adam Strawbridge (Daniel Hand) and Nan Zhao (Shelton)... Principals of CAS member high schools are given the opportunity to nominate one junior ranked in the top four percent of his/her class... An essay on an assigned topic has to be completed... Members of the Governor's Scholars Committee, professional educators from throughout Connecticut, judge the completed applications and assigned a composite score to each based on rank in class, PSAT or SAT scores, CAPT scores, and the student essay.

### **SCC Captains Council Luncheons**

The SCC Captains Council luncheons were held three times during the year at the New Haven Athletic Center, bringing together the captains before their respective seasons start to provide guidance of what it means to be a captain and the responsibility that comes with the position and enhance the ideals of sportsmanship... During the winter session in particular, several SCC captains were interviewed for a story by *New Haven Register* columnist Dave Solomon about their opinion of what a sports "role model" should be.

### **Derby Says Good-bye**

In late December, Derby High School announced it will leave the SCC to join the Naugatuck Valley League starting in the fall of 2009... A member of the SCC since the league's inception in 1994,

Derby was an active participant in all league activities and we wish them the best of luck... Derby will continue to play Shelton in football on Thanksgiving morning... In its 15 years in the SCC, Derby won four league



titles in wrestling (1999, 2000, 2001 and 2002), two cheerleading titles (2008 and 2009) and one football division title (2005)... In addition, the Red Raiders won four state championships – Class S baseball (1996) and Class S wrestling (1999-00, 2000-01 and 2001-02)... The departure of Derby leaves the SCC with 22 member schools.

### **State Championships**

It was another successful year as SCC member-schools fared extremely well in league and statewide competition... All told, SCC teams captured 12 state championships (3 fall, 5 winter, 3 spring) during the 2008-09 academic year... Eighteen additional teams (7 fall, 8 winter, 3 spring) earned runner-up status in CIAC state competition... Since the league's inception in 1994, SCC schools have won 277 state championships.

### **Good Sportsmanship**

Cheshire earned the "Ray Crew Sportsmanship Award," which is given to the SCC Division II ice hockey team in honor of the former Sheehan ice hockey coach... Fairfield Prep captured the "Dick Gagliardi Sportsmanship Award," which is given to the Division I team in honor of the former Hamden coach and SCC ice hockey chairperson.

### Lights, Camera, Action

The SCC was prominently featured on the WCTX/My TV 9 "High School Game of the Week" during 2008-09... The television package kicked off in the fall with football and continued into basketball season... During football season, WCTX/My TV 9 featured seven games involving 10 SCC schools in its package... Games were streamed live at www.wtnh.com and rebroadcast the next evening... In addition, MSG TV also televised a SCC football contest (Hand vs. Fairfield Prep) on Sept. 26... It was the second straight year that the SCC was televised on the popular regional sports network... Seven contests involving nine boys and girls basketball teams from SCC member schools, including both the league's girls (Feb. 26) and boys (March 4) championship games, were televised during the winter... "Televising the league championship games just adds to the prestige of our league," SCC commissioner Al Carbone told the New Haven Register when the basketball schedule was released in early December. "Televising the football games was a first step, and we were lucky because we had a lot of good games to offer. Continuing with the basketball in my mind solidifies we are pretty good in that sport as well. We have nine different boys' and girls' teams scheduled."

### The Best of the Best!

You can make a very good argument for the overall strength of the SCC when you look at the final state rankings of pretty much every sport... However, to have the "best team" is even more impressive...

### Girls Basketball - Hail to the "House"

Hillhouse, which won the SCC and Class L titles, finished as the top girls basketball team in the *New Haven Register*, *Hartford Courant* and Connecticut SportsWriters Alliance season-ending state polls... The Academics defeated Fairfield Warde, 65-59, in the Class L title game on March 20 at the Mohegan Sun Arena... Two other SCC teams - SCC and Class LL runner-up Career and Class LL quarterfinalist Mercy - also were ranked in the top ten.

### Ice Hockey - Hamden Dominates the Ice!

The 2009 SCC regular-season and state Division I champions, Hamden (19-4-1) finished as the top team in the final *New Haven Register* and *Hartford Courant* state rankings. Hamden, which defeated Glastonbury, 4-1, in the Division I championship game on March 21, is one of five SCC Division I teams (Fairfield Prep, Xavier, West Haven and Notre Dame) to be ranked in the final polls... In addition, 2009 SCC Division II regular season and playoff champion Cheshire captured the state Division II crown with a 3-2 victory over Enfield on March 20. The Rams finished seventh in the final *New Haven Register* state poll.

### Baseball - A Blue "Devil" of an Effort!

West Haven captured the Class LL state baseball title and earned the top ranking in the state...

# The Blue Devils (21-5), who defeated McMahon, 1-0, in the final, ranked #1 in both the *New Haven Register* and *Hartford Courant* final polls... In addition to West Haven, six other SCC teams were ranked in the top ten or received votes - *cementing the league's stature as the best in the state*... Branford, who defeated Berlin, 4-2 in the Class L championship game, finished second in the *Register* poll and fourth in the *Courant* poll... Shelton, the Class LL semifinalist, was in the top ten in both polls, while Jonathan Law (7th in *Register*) and Sheehan (10th in *Courant*)... Cheshire and Foran also received votes in the final polls.

### Boys Lacrosse - Prep(ped) for Success

Fairfield Prep, which captured its third straight SCC title, won its fourth consecutive Class L boys lacrosse title with a convincing 15-3 victory over Simsbury on June 13... The Jesuits (19-6) finished as the top-ranked team in the final *MaxPreps.com* state poll.

### "Courageous" Matson Honored by CSWA

Amity senior wrestler Steve Matson, who has overcome leukemia and a bone marrow transplant, was named the recipient of the Bob Casey Courage Award by the Connecticut Sports Writers Alliance... Matson was honored at the CSWA's annual "Gold Key" banquet on April 26... A 2009 Second Team All-SCC performer at 103 pounds, Matson won the Class LL title and placed fifth in the State Open... He finished his career with over 110 wins. Also a fine student, Matson was a member of the National Honor Society.

### Kalbian Finalist for High School Heisman

Irene Kalbian, a three-sport standout who ranked seventh in her class at Cheshire High School, was one of two Connecticut students among the 12 "national" finalists (out of 34,000 potential candidates) for the Wendy's High School Heisman Award. The WHSH recognizes the nation's most esteemed high school senior men and women for excellence in academics, athletics, and community/school leadership. ### **Loxsom Earns Gatorade State Honors**

Wilbur Cross senior Cas Loxsom was named the Gatorade State Track & Field Athlete of the Year... Loxsom, who will attend Penn State University in the fall, was the SCC, Class L and State Open champion in the 800 meters... Loxsom also was named by the *New Haven Register* as its Indoor Track All-Area Athlete of the Year... The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the track.
