Established in 1994, the Southern Connecticut Conference undertook its 20th year in 2013–14... One of the top -if not the best – high school leagues in the state of Connecticut, the athletic success of our member schools was once again outstanding in 2013-14 with 14 state championships won with another 22 teams earning runner-up status... Since the league's formation, SCC teams have won 379 state championships – an average of 19 per academic year ... More importantly, the league continued its positive tradition of offering first-rate non-athletic programs and events which seek to enrich our students' overall high school experience and make them responsible citizens. In additon, the year was marked by the acceptance of Lauralton Hall as the league's 23rd full member school.

Athletics Highlights

Captains Council

More than 800 sport captains attended the two SCC Captains Council events (winter and spring) held during the year at New Haven's Floyd Little Athletic Center. The meetings bring together the captains before their respective seasons start to provide guidance of what it means to be a captain and the responsibility that comes with the position and enhance the ideals of sportsmanship.

State Championships

It was another successful year as SCC member-schools fared extremely well in league and statewide athletic competition. All told, SCC teams captured 14 state championships (3 fall, 5 winter, 6 spring) during the 2013-14 academic year. Twenty-two additional teams (7 fall, 10 winter, 5 spring) earned runner-up status in CIAC state competition.

More State Championship Facts

Ten different SCC schools won state titles in 2013–14 with Daniel Hand capturing the most with three state titles... Guilford and Notre Dame each won two state titles.Since the league's inception in 1994, SCC schools have won 379 state championships. In those 20 years, Cheshire has won the most state championships (58) followed by Hillhouse (55), Amity (34), Daniel Hand (33) and Fairfield Prep (32).

Season-by-Season State Playoff Recap

In 2013-2014, two-thirds of eligible SCC teams (147–of–222, 66.2 %) qualified for CIAC state tournament competition in sports requiring a qualification (wins or winning percentage).

FALL (45-of-66), 68%

Sixty-eight percent of SCC teams qualified for the state tournaments in the following sports: field hockey (8-of-11), girls soccer (10-of-17), boys soccer (14-of-19) and girls volleyball (13-of-19). In addition, four football teams (out of 19) earned state playoff berths.

WINTER (45-of-66), 68%

Sixty-eight percent of SCC teams qualified for the state tournaments in the following sports: boys ice hockey (15-of-16), boys basketball (13-of-20), girls basketball (12-of-19) and girls ice hockey (5-of-11).

SPRING (57-of-90), 63.3%

Sixty-three percent of SCC teams qualified for CIAC spring team sport playoff competition in baseball (12–of–19), softball (11–of–19), boys lacrosse (11–of–17), girls lacrosse (10–of–13), boys volleyball (3–of–5) and girls tennis (10–of–17).

SCC vs. SCC - For all the Marbles

During 2013-14, there were three All-SCC state championship contests. In the fall, Guilford defeated Branford, 2-0, in the Class L state final at West Haven HS. In the winter, Simsbury defeated Guilford, 3-1, in the state girls ice hockey championship game at Yale's Ingalls Rink. Two weeks later, Daniel Hand held off league-rival Amity Regional, 5-4, in the Division II boys ice hockey final at Ingalls Rink. Since 1994, there have been 21 All-SCC state championship game matchups in 10 different sports, including 10 in the last five years.

Alvarado Earns Trifecta

Fairfield Prep senior **Christian Alvarado** was the Most Outstanding Performer (and also was selected the SCC/OrthoNOW Athlete of the Year) in all three running sports (cross country, indoor and outdoor track) championship meets in 2013-14. In fact, Christian has been the MOP in each of the last six events. Alvarado will attend Georgetown.

Rivers Named Athlete of the Year

Wilbur Cross sophomore **Danae Rivers** was named the *New Haven Register's* 2013–14 Female Athlete of the Year. Danae was a three-sport (cross country, indoor and outdoor track) standout for the Governors. An All-SCC honoree in each sport, Danae was the SCC Indoor and Outdoor Track Athlete of the Year. Danae is the 25th student athlete – since 1996-97 – from the SCC to earn this prestigious honor.

History of Success

In 2013–14, three SCC teams finished as the #1 team in their respective sports' season-ending media or coaches polls. That brings the total to 15 in the last three years.

SCC "Best of... 2013-14"

Town Fair Tire was the sponsor of the SCC's "Best of... for 2013-14," an online poll to determine the best moment or performance in the Southern Connecticut Conference during the academic year. Nearly 600 votes were cast.

- Xavier tennis freshman Richard Ciamarra wins SCC Division II Player of the Year on his way to capturing the Class LL and State Open singles titles.
- Lauralton Hall of Milford joins the SCC as the league's 23rd full member.
- West Haven's Ed McCarthy becomes the state's all-time winningest football coach with a win over Hamden on October 26.
- On November 16, Guilford defeats league-rival Branford in the Class L girls soccer state championship game just two weeks after winning the SCC title over the Hornets.
- Fairfield Prep senior Christian Alvarado completes the triple crown he is named Most Outstanding Athlete in the SCC cross country, indoor track and outdoor track & field championship meets.
- Despite starting the season 0-3, Amity Regional wins its second straight Class LL baseball title, defeating Southington, 8-2, on June 15.

- Fairfield Prep boys swimming team captured its 10th straight SCC title with a dominating effort on March 5.
- Fairfield Prep captures its first-ever SCC boys basketball title; the Jesuits defeat Hillhouse, 56-52, in the title game on March 5.
- Led by senior Stefani Taschner, the Daniel Hand gymnastics team captures both the SCC and Class M state titles.
- Week #1 of football season has teams from the SCC and FCIAC compete in 17 games with the FCIAC holding a slim, 9-8 edge.
- Guilford girls ice hockey team blanks Darien, 2-1, in overtime in the state semifinals to reach its first-ever state championship game.
- North Haven's Rasmey Kong shoots a one-under 70 to earn medalist honors at the SCC Golf Championship on May 27. Kong goes on to capture medalist honors at the Division II state tournament two week later.
- Wilbur Cross sophomore Danae Rivers sets an Indoor Track State Open record in the mile (4:52.29 seconds). She then went on to claim the mile crown at the New England Championships, and finish fourth at the national meet.
- Ben Solin scores three goals, including the game-winner, as Daniel Hand defeated league-rival Amity, 5-4, in the Division II state boys ice hockey title game.
- Notre Dame-Fairfield, Branford and New Fairfield-Immaculate win playoff titles in the first year of the SCC-SWC Boys Ice Hockey League.
- Branford's Anna Atkinson wins the state heptathlon becoming the third straight SCC winner.
- Daniel Hand boys and girls tennis team both capture league titles with exciting, hard-fought 4-3 victories over Amity in the SCC championship matches on May 30.
- A league-record three SCC softball teams Amity Regional (LL), Sacred Heart Academy (L) and East Haven (M) reach state title games. It is the fourth straight year at least two SCC teams reached the championship game.
- Fairfield Prep avenges two regular-season losses to Darien and defeats the Blue Wave, 2-1, in the Division I state ice hockey championship game.
- On June 13, Shelton's Peter Cotto completed a sweep of the discus competition, winning the New England title with a throw of 165'7". Cotto also won the SCC, Class LL and State Open titles.

Connecticut Orthopaedic Specialists Awards "Comeback Player" Scholarships

Two senior student athletes – **Stefani Taschner (Daniel Hand)** and **Eric Laugeni (Amity Regional HS)** – were the recipients of the 2014 SCC "Comeback Player of the Year" scholarship award, presented by Connecticut Orthopaedic Specialists (COS). Both students overcame severe injuries during their high school careers, yet were able to overcome them to become outstanding role models in their respective schools.

A corporate sponsor of the Southern Connecticut Conference (SCC), Connecticut Orthopaedic Specialists P.C. (COS) has offered a Comeback Player of the Year Scholarship for one male and one female athlete who participated in an interscholastic sport during the 2013-2014 academic year, and showed great leadership both on and off the field after their severe injury.

Coaches and school's athletic directors nominated these studentathletes after they each suffered an unfortunate injury that prohibited them from play during



their high school careers. Stefani and Eric each received a \$1,000 scholarship to be used for their college education.

"This is our fourth year in awarding student-athletes from the SCC with scholarships," explained Glenn Elia, Chief Executive Officer of COS. "Our goal has been to acknowledge two athletes that have overcome the challenges of an injury and, through hard work and

determination, have become positive role models for their fellow teammates."

"Many thanks to the doctors and staff at Connecticut Orthopaedic Specialists for their support of the SCC and this scholarship," explained SCC Commissioner Al Carbone. "Our league has many outstanding student-athletes who excel in the classroom and on the playing fields, and we are delighted that two exceptional young people in can be recognized for their admirable stories of perseverance."

Stefani Taschner, Daniel Hand - gymnastics

Stefani recently completed a fabulous senior season for the Tigers' SCC and Class M state champion gymnastics team. Selected the 2014 SCC Gymnast of the Year, Stefani also earned All-SCC, All-State, All-New England and Elite All-American honors, all after undergoing ankle surgery last spring. Her surgery was required after she suffered a series of severe ankle sprains.

Stefani's work ethic following her surgery was remarkable; her positive attitude and competitiveness allowed her to not miss a beat, returning to a high level of performance as indicated by the slew of accolades she received following the season.

Daniel Hand gymnastics head coach Kelly Smith said, "Stefani's ability to overcome her surgery was imperative to her individual success and the success of the team. Her leadership, her performances, and her camaraderie with her teammates created a positive atmosphere in our gym. She inspired her coaches and teammates with her positive attitude, hard work and focus." Stefani will attend Towson University and is interested in studying criminal justice.

Eric Laugeni, Amity Regional - football

In the summer of 2008, Eric Laugeni was involved in a freak accident involving a fork lift that severed his left leg and his right leg was broken and dislocated. After numerous hours of surgery, doctors saved his leg, but cast a dubious outlook for him in terms of running. More surgeries and rehabilitation occurred, and Eric began to walk by himself and eventually returned to athletics, but only through a sheer determination and unending work ethic. He played varsity football for the Spartans, and he served as the team's co-captain this past fall.

Amity head football coach Bert Mozealous said, "Eric has worked so hard to overcome so much. That's why I believe he was voted captain because his teammates were so impressed with his work ethic and his sacrifice."

A standout student in the classroom and a member of the National Honor Society, Eric plans to attend the Lehigh University in the fall.
