25th Year

Established in 1994, the Southern Connecticut Conference completed its 25th year in 2018–19. One of the most competitive high school leagues in the state of Connecticut, the athletic success of SCC member schools was once again outstanding in 2018–19 with 19 state championships won; and another 20 teams earned state runner-up status. Since the league's formation in 1994-95, SCC teams have won 464 state championships – an average of 18 per academic year. More importantly, the league has continued its positive tradition of offering first-rate non-athletic programs and events which seek to enrich our students' overall high school experience and make them responsible citizens.

2018-19 Year-in-Review

CAPTAINS COUNCIL

More than 1,200 sport captains attended the three SCC Captains Council events (fall, winter and spring) held during the year at New Haven's Floyd Little Athletic Center. The meetings brought together the captains of each sport before their respective seasons start to provide guidance of what it means to be a captain and the responsibility that comes with the position and enhance the ideals of sportsmanship. In addition, guest speakers presented on topics of social media and leadership/communication skills.

STATE CHAMPIONSHIP CONFERENCE

It was another successful year as SCC member-schools fared extremely well in league and statewide athletic competition. All told, SCC teams captured 19 state championships (8 fall, 7 winter, 4 spring) during the 2018-19 academic year. Twenty additional teams (6 fall, 10 winter, 4 spring) earned runner-up status in CIAC state competition.

MORE STATE CHAMPIONSHIP FACTS

Nine different SCC schools won state titles in 2018–19 with Daniel Hand and Hillhouse each winning the most with five each. Since the league's inception in 1994, SCC schools have won 464 state championships. In those 25 years, Hillhouse has won the most state championships (72) followed by Cheshire (62), Daniel Hand (50), Amity Regional (41) and Fairfield Prep (35).

SEASON-BY-SEASON STATE PLAYOFF RECAP

In 2018-2019, more than two-thirds of eligible SCC teams (168–of–245, 68.6%) qualified for CIAC state tournament competition in sports that have a winning percentage requirement.

FALL (47-OF-70), 67%

Sixty-seven percent of SCC teams qualified for the state tournaments in the following fall sports: field hockey (8-of-13), girls soccer (12-of-18), boys soccer (13-of-19) and girls volleyball (14-of-20). In addition, five football teams (out of 21) earned state playoff berths.

WINTER (57-OF-80), 71%

Seventy-one percent of SCC teams qualified for the state tournaments in the following winter sports: boys ice hockey (21-of-25), boys basketball (12-of-19), girls basketball (16-of-20) and girls ice hockey (8-of-15).

Spring (64-of-95), 67%

Sixty-seven percent of SCC teams qualified for CIAC spring team sport playoff competition in baseball (16–of–19), softball (13–of–20), boys lacrosse (12–of–17), girls lacrosse (9–of–16), boys volleyball (3–of–5) and girls tennis (11–of–18).

SCC vs. SCC - For all the Marbles

During 2018-19, there were five All-SCC state championship contests. Since 1994, there have been 35 All-SCC state championship game matchups in 12 different sports, including 24 in the last decade.

JUODAITIS/DELUCIA NAMED ATHLETES OF THE YEAR

Cheshire senior Mia Juodaitis and Guilford senior John DeLucia were named the New Haven Register's 2018–19 Athletes of the Year. Mia (a volleyball, basketball and softball standout for the Rams) and John (an ice hockey and lacrosse standout) were outstanding for their respective schools on the playing fields and in the classroom. Mia and John are the 33rd and 34th student athletes – since 1996-97 – from the SCC to earn this prestigious honor. Mia will attend Providence College to play softball and John will attend Quinnipiac University to play lacrosse.

BILL O'BRIEN COMMUNITY SERVICE SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS:

Two scholar leaders -- **Makayla Dawkins (Hillhouse)** *and* **Thomas Rudden (Fairfield Prep)** - were the recipients of the Bill O'Brien Community Service scholarships. Each received \$500.

• Thomas took a leap of faith by creating an organization called REIGNS. Its title stands for the Respect, Education, and Inclusion of Gay and Non-Binary Students, and provides a safe space at school for LGBTQ students to feel validated and loved by peers, faculty, and the school. REIGNS helps to improve the school environment through dialogue, education, and inclusion.

• Makayla is a student representative on both the New Haven and State Boards of Education. She is currently leading a project and will present to the state board at the end of my term that focuses on the arts, team building, and other coping strategies through trauma and healing workshops for her peers. One of the workshops would be "Creating and Calming" which would be in the form art therapy. This will give people the opportunity to express themselves beyond the traditional mode of talk therapy without the worry of financial barriers or the stigma around seeking assistance for mental health support.

Tigers, Tigers: Daniel Hand boys soccer wins their third consecutive Class L title, defeating Maloney, 1-0.

Tiger Prey: Daniel Hand football rolls through Class L on its way to its second straight state title. The Tigers outscored their three opponents, 159 to 21.

Spartans Rejoice: Amity Regional makes an impressive run and wins the Class LL girls volleyball state title. The Spartans defeated Darien, 3-1 (27-25, 26-24, 22-25, 25-22) in the final.

Kitty's Indians: Under the direction of long-time head coach Kitty Palmer, Guilford wins its first-ever SCC field hockey title, and goes on to win the Class M state title – also its first – defeating SCC rival, Sacred Heart Academy, 3-1.

Gael Kicks: After 100 minutes of scoreless action, Shelton outlasts Mercy via penalty kicks (3-2) to win the SCC girls soccer title.

Rams Swim Fast: After capturing its 24th SCC title in the last 25 years, Cheshire girls swimming wins the Class L state title.

Falcon Harriers: Xavier boys cross country rolls to the SCC title, and then adds the Class L and State Open titles.

Bloss and Indians Run to Title: Meredith Bloss wins the SCC girls cross country individual title for the second straight year leading Guilford to their second consecutive league crown.

Prep on the Pitch: Fairfield Prep wins its first SCC boys soccer title since 2014, scoring a late second-half goal to defeat previously undefeated Xavier.

Coming up Aces: Hillhouse boys and girls capture SCC indoor track titles and then both win state titles.

Prep Swim Rolls: Fairfield Prep wins its 14th consecutive boys swimming title, winning by 340 points over runner-up Cheshire.

Green Dragons on Fire: Led by Taniya Thompson, who averaged 29.3 points in three games, Hamden girls basketball captures their first-ever SCC title. The Green Dragons defeated Sheehan, Hillhouse and East Haven.

Governors Win: Wilbur Cross boys basketball wins the SCC boys basketball title, its first league title since 2008. The Governors defeated Notre Dame, 54-40, in the title game.

All-Hail the Blades: The Blades girls ice hockey team (Amity Regional-North Haven-Cheshire) win the SCC South Division title with a 4-3 win over West Haven/Sacred Heart Academy.

X-Men: Xavier wrestling captures its third straight SCC title. The Falcons totaled 199.5 points, 61 better than runner-up Foran.

Mercy, Mercy, Mercy: Mercy gymnastics wins the SCC title, ending Daniel Hand's 10-year streak.

Cheer!: North Haven cheerleading wins the SCC and Class L state titles.

Wally World: Lyman Hall defeats cross-town rival Sheehan, 6-2, to win the Division III state boys ice hockey title.

Dread the Red: Branford wins the SCC and State Division II boys ice hockey titles. The Hornets defeated Water-town-Pomperaug, 2-1, in the SCC final, and then allowed just four goals in four games to capture the Division II state championship.

Prep Puck: Fairfield Prep defeats SCC-rival Notre Dame, 5-2, in the Division I state boys ice hockey championship game. It is Prep's second straight state title.

House Family: Hillhouse girls basketball defeats East Haven, Notre Dame-Fairfield and Daniel Hand to capture the Class L state title.

Coming up Aces: Hillhouse's boys and girls outdoor track & field teams both win the SCC title and then both win state titles (boys, Class MM; girls Class M).

Jesuit Lax: Fairfield Prep wins the SCC boys lacrosse title (defeating Guilford, 13-7) for the eighth time in the last nine seasons.

Extra Indians: Guilford defeats Cheshire in sudden-death overtime, 11-10, to win their first-ever girls lacrosse title.

Ram Power: Cheshire wins the SCC baseball title for the second time; defeated long-time rival Amity Regional, 4-3, in the final.

Ram Comeback: Cheshire wins the SCC softball title in comeback fashion; defeating North Haven, 3-2, in eight innings.

Tigers Going Low: Daniel Hand boys golf wins the SCC title by the widest margin in league history (19 strokes), and then adds a Division II state title a week later.

Ram Spikers: Cheshire wins the SCC boys volleyball title defeating Daniel Hand, 3-1, avenging last season's championship match loss to the Tigers. The Rams would go on to reach the Class M state finals.

Spartans Repeat: Amity Regional wins its second straight girls golf title, led by medalist Tess Csejka (73).

Great Day to be a Tiger: Daniel Hand girls and boys tennis both win SCC tennis titles, defeating Amity Regional. The boys won, 7-0, while the girls triumphed, 5-2.

Kitty's Tigers: The Daniel Hand girls tennis team won the Class M state championship with a 6-1 victory over SCC-rival Lauralton Hall. Daniel Hand head coach Kitty Palmer wins her second state title of the academic year (she also led Guilford field hockey to a state title in the fall).

CONNECTICUT ORTHOPAEDIC SPECIALISTS Awards Comeback Players of the Year"

Two student athletes – Erin Keary (Shelton HS) and Thomas LaTorre (Daniel Hand HS) – are the recipients of the 2019 SCC "Comeback Player of the Year" awards.Both students suffered severe injuries, yet were able to overcome them to become outstanding role models in their respective schools.

A long-time league corporate sponsor, Connecticut Orthopaedic Specialists P.C. (COS) has offered a Comeback Player of the Year Scholarship for student-athletes who participated in an interscholastic sport during the 2018-2019 academic year and showed great leadership both on and off the field after their severe injury.

Coaches and school's athletic directors nominated these student-athletes after they each suffered an unfortunate injury that prohibited them from playing for their high school teams. Both will receive a financial scholarship to be used for their college education.

"This is our ninth year in awarding student-athletes from the SCC with scholarships," explained Glenn Elia, Chief Executive Officer of COS. "Our goal has been to acknowledge studentathletes who have overcome the challenges of an injury and. through hard work and determination, have become positive role models for their fellow teammates. Because we are sports medicine specialists, we understand

intimately what it takes to recover from an injury and return to playing sports at a high level."

THOMAS LATORRE, DANIEL HAND HS (SOCCER)

Tommy tore his ACL in the spring of his junior year, while playing at a college showcase soccer tournament. He received surgery in April 2018 and undertook extensive rehabilitation - most of the time in the morning before school started - to return to the team, one that was coming off two straight Class L state titles and one he would serve as one of the team's captains. During his physical therapy, Tommy worked diligently and was cleared to play mid-season (in October) and was a catalyst as the Tigers earned their third straight Class L state title, culminating with a 2-1 victory over Maloney on Nov. 18. Tommy will attend Elon University in the fall with plans to major in sports management.



Daniel Hand head soccer coach Greg Cumpstone said, "While injured, Tommy served as a source of support and leadership to his teammates. His return to the field gave the team the fire that was infectious; he was up for any battle, and his actions on the field became crucial to the team's late-season state championship run."

ERIN KEARY, SHELTON (SOCCER)

A four-year starter at defensive center, Erin sustained an ACL injury during the 2017 state girls soccer tournament. Erin showed her dedication through the rehab process, following the regiment set for her with diligence and persistence, starting with spring workouts, into the summer and fall preseason. Her return to the field in 2018 was admirable, but also impressive. She played in all 20 games, leading the team in minutes played and also scored six goals

and added four assists from her defensive position as the Gaels won the SCC playoff title. For her efforts, she earned All-SCC and Second Team All-State honors. Erin will attend the University of Connecticut in the fall with plans to major in Allied Heath Sciences.



Shelton head girls soccer coach Marvin Miller said, "Persistence has always been Erin's strongest character attributes along with her extremely high personal expectations she puts on herself as a student and as an athlete. With that, she has earned the respect of her opponents and teammates and holds a place of honor with them."

SCC Postseason Facts

32 Playoff Champions Crowned: In 2018-19, thirty-two SCC champions (17 girls, 15 boys) were crowned in 28 different sports.

14 Schools Earned a Plaque: In 2018-19, fourteen different member schools won or shared a SCC playoff title. Fourteen different schools earned runner-up finishes in league playoff competition.

Ram Pride: Cheshire won a league-best five SCC titles in 2018-19, including three titles in the spring season. Daniel Hand and Hillhouse each had four titles.

Girls Champion: Guilford and Cheshire each won the most girls playoff titles (3).

Boys Champion: Fairfield Prep won the most boys playoff titles (3), winning soccer, swimming and lacrosse.
