

# 2019-20 YEAR-IN-REVIEW

#### COVID-19 PANDEMIC AFFECTS 2019-20

On Tuesday, March 10, what was left of winter state tournaments were unfortunately cancelled by the CIAC, and the spring sports season was never started. Finally on May 5, Governor Ned Lamont announced Connecticut's schools would not reopen until the fall, and the CIAC Board of Control made the final decision to cancel the spring sports season -- the first time an entire sports season was not played.

#### CAPTAINS COUNCIL

More than 800 sport captains attended the two SCC Captains Council events (fall and winter; spring was cancelled) held during the year at New Haven's Floyd Little Athletic Center.

The meetings brought together the captains of each sport before their respective seasons start to provide guidance of what it means to be a captain and the responsibility that comes with the position and enhance the ideals of sportsmanship. In addition, guest speakers presented on topics of social media and leadership/communication skills.

#### STATE CHAMPIONSHIP CONFERENCE

Despite having a short-circuited winter (no basketball, ice hockey or boys swimming state playoffs) and an entire spring season that was cancelled, the 2019-20 proved to be another successful year as SCC member-schools fared extremely well in league and statewide athletic competition.

All told, SCC teams captured 11 state championships (8 fall and 3 winter) during the 2019-20 academic year. The eight state titles in the fall were tied for the the second-most in league history.

Ten additional teams (5 fall and 5 winter ) earned runner-up status in CIAC state competition during 2019-20.

#### More State Championship Facts

Seven different SCC schools won state titles in 2019–20; albeit just the fall and part of the winter season. Four schools won multiple state titles: Xavier (cross country, wrestling), Guilford (girls soccer and field hockey), Daniel Hand (boys soccer, cheerleading) and Cheshire (girls swimming - Class L and State Open).

Since the league's inception in 1994, SCC schools have won 476 state championships. In those 26 years, Hillhouse has won the most state championships (73) followed by Cheshire (64), Daniel Hand (52), Amity Regional (41) and Fairfield Prep (35).

#### CONNECTICUT HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL ALLIANCE

Once again, the SCC excelled in the Connecticut High School Football Alliance games that were scheduled during the 2019 regular-season.

The Alliance expanded in 2019 with teams from the FCIAC and CCC being included with the SWC and ECC. SCC teams went 39-32 (.549) in the games, which were played in weeks 2,3, 6 and 7. All eight state playoff finalists, including SCC's Sheehan and Daniel Hand, played multiple Alliance games in 2019. In the last two seasons, SCC teams have recorded a 60-44 record (.577 winning percentage) in the Alliance.

#### SCC vs. SCC - For all the Marbles

During 2019-20, there was one All-SCC state championship contest. On Nov. 23, topranked Guilford defeated its long-time SCC rival Daniel Hand, 3-2, in the Class M field hockey state championship game at Wethersfield High School.

Since 1994, there have been 36 All-SCC state championship game matchups in 12 different sports. It was also the second straight year two SCC teams meet in the Class M state field hockey final (Guilford defeated Sacred Heart Academy in 2018).

#### **Bill O'Brien Scholarship Winners**

Two scholar leaders -- **Miriam Khan (Hamden)** and **Ella Stanley (Guilford)** - were the recipients of the Bill O'Brien Community Service scholarships.

Bill O'Brien served as Commissioner of the SCC for 10 years (1994-2004) and remains active with the conference. A retired banking executive, Bill is well-known for his passionate and unselfish community service efforts throughout the greater New Haven area. Each year, two \$500 scholarships are awarded in Bill's honor. Recipients have a healthy balance of school and community activities that are value-added and embody the "spirit and passion" of Bill.

#### Mariam Khan, Hamden HS (pictured left)

Mariam founded the Global Youth Activists Club to "amplify youth voices, fight for marginalized communities, and use empathy to combat hate. Under her leadership, GYAC organized a mayoral debate for students, held a coat drive for local refugees, and handled gracefully, some messy issues the school faced. Mariam wrote in her essay, " Leadership is vulnerability – it's finding strength in your failures. Leadership is hope – it's continuing to fight in the face of adversity. Leadership is growth – it's becoming your most apologetic self." Miriam will attend Yale University in the fall.

#### Ella Stanley, Guilford HS (pictured right)

A standout student-athlete (field hockey and fencing), Ella founded the "Big Sleep Out," a homelessness initiative that has raised more than \$16,000 to support the Columbus House and help nearly 500 people. Ella wrote in her essay, "Participants learned to see beyond their own perspectives and how them not as homeless people, but people who were homeless." Ella will attend Harvard University in the fall.

# SCC's BEST OF.... 2019-20

Town Fair Tire was the presenting sponsor of the SCC's "BEST OF... FOR 2019-20," an online poll to determine the best moment or performance in the Southern Connecticut Conference during the academic year. More than 6,000 votes were cast.

### THE WINNER: GUILFORD GIRLS SOCCER

After winning its first SCC title since 2014, the Guilford girls soccer team proceeds to win five more matches, culminating with a 2-1 victory over East Lyme in the Class L state title game on Nov. 23.

### MORE TOP SCC MOMENTS FROM 2019-20...

**A Fall of Titles:** Guilford completed one the most impressive seasons in league history, winning five league titles in the fall (girls cross country, field hockey, boys soccer, girls soccer, and girls volleyball). It was the most titles won by a school in one season in league history.

**House Party:** The Hillhouse boys indoor track team won its sixth straight state title, winning the Class L title in 2020. The Academics have now won nine state titles in the last 11 years.

**COVID-19 Wreaks Havoc:** Internationally pandemic halted Winter State Tournaments and the entire spring sports season was cancelled.

**Titans Rejoice:** Sheehan wins the Class S football title with a resounding 64-33 victory over previously unbeaten Bloomfield. The Titans (11-2) outscored the Warhawks, 36-6, in the second half to win their first state title since 1985.

**Green Dragons on Fire:** Hamden wins its second straight SCC girls basketball title. The seventh-seeded Green Dragons defeated #10 Hillhouse (42-36), #2 Sheehan (52-44), #6 Shelton (56-49) and #4 East Haven (40-36) to capture the title.

**Daniel Hand Boys Indoor Track:** Daniel Hand won its first-ever SCC boys indoor track title in 2020. The Tigers (83 points) won easily over runner-up Shelton (52).

A Titan First Title – Sheehan captured its first-ever SCC girls indoor track title in 2020. The Lady Titans (68 points) bested runner-up Hillhouse (62), ending the Lady Academics' three-year title run.

**The Law Won** – Jonathan Law captured the 2020 SCC gymnastics title, narrowly ahead (0.2 points) of runner-up Mercy. It was the closest margin in league championship meet history.

**Momma Mia, Here We Go Again:** Mercy senior Mia Lawrence won three of the four events on her way to the all-around title and earned the "Melanie Coleman" SCC Meet's Most Outstanding Gymnast award for the second straight year.

Xavier Boys Swimming: Led by the meet's Most Outstanding Performer Andrew Mitchell, Xavier won its first-ever SCC boys swimming title and ended Fairfield Prep's outstanding 15-year run as league champions.

**Guilford Girls Ice Hockey:** Guilford, which is the lone SCC stand-alone girls ice hockey team, won the 2020 girls ice hockey title with a 4-2 victory over top-seeded Amity/North Haven/Cheshire co-op.

**Branford Puck Repeats** – Culminating one of the most competitive Division II league tournaments, Branford defeated an outstanding North Haven contingent, 1-0, in the final. It was Branford's second straight league title.

**Fairfield Prep Goes to Shoot-out for Div 1 Title:** After playing a fast-paced 60 minutes of hockey, Fairfield Prep scored three times in the shootout and did not allow a Notre Dame tally, to win 3-2 in the SCC/SWC Division I title game before a jam-packed crowd at The Bennett Rink. It was the Jesuits' second SCC/SWC title in the last three years.

**Guilford Girls Soccer:** The Guilford girls soccer team, led by captains Madison Gambardella and Gabi Garcia-Perez, won the SCC and Class L state titles in 2019.



# SCC's Best of.... 2019-20 - CONTINUED



Spiker Success: Led the SCC Player of the Year Emma Appleman, the Guilford girls volleyball team captured its first SCC title since 1994 with an exciting five-set thriller against second-seeded Shelton (25-11, 15-25, 22-25, 25-21, 15-10).

Governors Repeat: Wilbur Cross wins its second straight SCC boys basketball title. The sixth-seeded Governors defeated #11 Amity Regional (58-45), #3 Shelton (56-53), #2 Hillhouse (63-53) and top-seeded Notre Dame (49-48) to win its seventh overall league title.

X-Men Duo: Xavier had two State Open wrestling champions: junior Mike Rapuano at 113 pounds and senior James Lunt at 145 pounds. Lunt finished sixth at the State Open last year, so this capped off a trifecta for him: SCC, Class L and State Open titles.

Hat Trick for Sheehan: Sheehan scored five first-period goals on its way to a 7-1 victory over New Milford in the SCC/SWC Division III boys ice hockey final. It was the Titans' third consecutive league title.

X-MEN on the Mat – The Xavier wrestling team won its fourth consecutive SCC wrestling title, and its sixth in the last seven years, before winning the Class L state title a week later.

Shark Attack: After recording four wins in previous two seasons combined, the Sacred Heart Academy girls basketball team records 17 regular-season victories and earns its first state tournament victory since 2017.

X-MEN Run: The Xavier boys cross country team won its fourth straight SCC title in 2019, and then captured the Class L state title a week later.

Robbie Runs Fast: Xavier senior Robbie Cozean had an incredible cross country season, winning both the SCC and Class L meets, while finishing second at the State Open and New England championship meets.

Eastie Brotherly Love: The three DiVito brothers all earned All-SCC wrestling recognition in 2019-20. Mathew (126 lbs.), Alec (132 lbs.) and Tanner (138 lbs.) as made it to the championship match in their respective weight classes. The DiVito brothers led the Yellowjackets to a runner-up finish - its best team result since 2000.

Pool Hopping -- Cheshire Girls Swimming – The Cheshire girls swimming team finished a dominating 2019 season, winning the SCC (for the 25th time in 26 years), Class L and State Open titles.

North Haven Girls Swimming: Led by SCC Swimmer of the Year Angela Gambardella, the North Haven girls swimming won the Class M state title in 2019.

Daniel Hand Boys Soccer Gets 4: After falling in the SCC final, the Daniel Hand boys soccer won its fourth straight Class L state title, defeating Wilton, 4-3, in double overtime. The Tigers reached the final by defeating league-rival Guilford, 2-1 (4-3 via penalty kicks), avenging their SCC finals loss to the Indians two weeks earlier.

Palmer's Perfect: Under the direction of long-time head coach Kitty Palmer, Guilford repeated as SCC and Class M state field hockey champions. The Indians finished the 2019 season with a perfect 23-0 season, culminating with a 3-2 win over league-rival Daniel Hand in the Class M final.

Give a Cheer for Hand: Daniel Hand won the Class L cheerleading state title in 2020, finishing just ahead of league-rival North 5 Haven (177.70 to 176.40).



All three students suffered severe injuries, yet were able to overcome them to become outstanding role models in their respective schools.

A corporate sponsor of the Southern Connecticut Conference (SCC), Connecticut Orthopaedics has offered a Comeback Player of the Year Scholarship for student-athletes who participated in an interscholastic sport during the 2019-2020 academic year and showed great leadership both on and off the field after their severe injury.

Coaches and school's athletic directors nominated these student-athletes after they each suffered an unfortunate injury that prohibited them from playing for their high school teams. All three will receive a financial scholarship to be used for their college education.

During his junior football season, Edwin suffered his injury (fractured tibia and torn ligaments in ankle) which led him to surgery. Edwin was diligent in his rehabilitation and showed leadership by continuing to encourage his teammates through the offseason. He returned to the field last fall and helped lead the Green Dragons to a 6-4 record, their best in nearly 15 years. Edwin will attend Western Connecticut State University in the fall with plans to play football for the Colonials and is interested in its nursing program.

#### MIA LAWRENCE, Mercy HS (gymnastics)

One of the top gymnasts in the history of the Southern Connecticut Conference, Mia won the All-Around title at the SCC championship meet in early February 2019. A week later, she sustained a broken ankle, ending her junior season. Through her hard work and dedication, she returned to the mat and once again, won the SCC All-Around title at the 2020 championship meet and was named the league's Gymnast of the Year and earned New Haven Register All-Area MVP honors. Mia will attend Quinnipiac University in the fall with plans to major in occupational therapy.

#### KYLE MARUCA, North Haven HS (football/track & field)

A two-way football standout for the Indians, Kyle injured his shoulder in the first game of the season in 2018. He played with the injury the rest of the season before requiring surgery to repair a torn labrum. Prior to surgery in April, Kyle was still able to participate in indoor and outdoor track, throwing the shot put and actually won the SCC indoor title in 2019. Following his rehabilitation, he was cleared to return to football practice without contact and had to miss the first three weeks of football season. Upon his return to the field as a tight end/defensive lineman, he was a big reason why the Indians went 5-1 with him in the lineup. Kyle will attend Merrimack University in the fall and will participate in track & field for the Warriors.
