THE WINNER:

Much More Of Moore - HILLHOUSE'S GARY MOORE, JR. HAS RECORD-BREAKING YEAR

Hillhouse senior Gary Moore, Jr. completes an outstanding scholastic career by winning the State Hammer Throw on June 13. He is the first high school athlete to end his CIAC career with wins in all four throwing events. In addition to the CIAC hammer throw, at the State Open he won the shot put, discus and javelin. Moore also set a state indoor record in the shot put during the winter season. He was a four-time SCC athlete of year (2 indoor track, 2 outdoor track).

More top SCC moments from 2021-22...

Jesuits Swim Fast -- In a highly-competitive championship meet, Fairfield Prep captures the 2022 SCC boys swimming title, outpointing runner-up Xavier (1007 to 957) on March 2.

Cheer for the Cheerleaders -- Daniel Hand wins the 2022 SCC Cheerleading Competition, narrowly defeating runner-up East Haven and eventual Class L champion Shelton. The Tigers proceeded to earn runner-up status at the Class M state meet.

Many Maddie Returns --- Guilford senior Maddie Epke completes her outstanding high school career with four state titles (2 in field hockey, 2 in lacrosse) and nine SCC titles (4 in field hockey, 3 in lacrosse and 2 in girls ice hockey). In addition, Epke earned five SCC Player of Year awards (2 in lacrosse, 2 in ice hockey and one field hockey).

The House Rules -- Hillhouse rolls to the SCC boys outdoor track & field championships, and then wins the Class L and State Open titles. It was the fifth time in league history – and first since 2002 - that a SCC boys outdoor team won both titles.

All in the Family -- Wilbur Cross siblings – Nikita and Anna Omelchenko become the first brother-and-sister combo to qualify for the New England Boys and Girls Cross Country championships, which were held on Nov. 12 in Thetford, Vermont.

Mercy, Mercy --- After coming from behind to tie the score at 2 at the end of regulation, Mercy ultimately prevails via penalty kicks (5-4) against Amity Regional to capture the SCC girls soccer title on Nov. 4.

Spartans Swim Fast -- Amity Regional wins the SCC girls swimming title on November 3 at Southern Connecticut State University. The Spartans outpointed nine-time defending Cheshire by just 15 points to capture its second SCC crown.

The Last Co-Champ -- Mercy and Sacred Heart Academy play to a scoreless tie in the Class M state girls soccer championship game on November 20. They are the final state co-champions in soccer as the state voted to decide a winner via penalty kicks for future state title games.

Five-Peat -- Guilford captures its fifth consecutive SCC girls cross country title on October 20 and then goes on to win the Class M state title.

All-Around Audrey -- Shelton junior Audrey Kozak completes an outstanding outdoor track & field season by winning the State Heptathlon – outpointing the runner-up by 333 points - on June 15.

Indoor Falcons -- Xavier's indoor track team wins the SCC and Class L titles in 2022. In the Class L meet on Feb. 12, the Falcons totaled 86.5 points with SCC-rival Hillhouse coming in second (54).

Give them a Hand -- Daniel Hand wins the SCC and Class S gymnastics titles. The Tigers then finished second (by just 1.95 points to Woodstock Academy) in the 2022 State Open on March 5.

Protect your Hand -- The Daniel Hand boys basketball team, which made the SCC semifinals for the first time in 15 seasons, wins the Division III state championship – its first ever state title – defeating top-seeded Kolbe Cathedral, 56-39, at Mohegan Sun Arena.

Five Times a Charm -- After finishing as the SCC runner-up the previous four seasons, Notre Dame wins its first-ever league boys basketball title, defeating Fairfield Prep, 53-45, on March 2. The Green Knights reached the state Division I championship game before falling to East Catholic.

Guilford Fockey Fun -- Guilford wins the SCC and Class M field hockey titles. The Grizzlies defeated Cheshire, 3-0, in the league final before outscoring their opponents, 23-0, over four games to win the Class M state title. Guilford finished the 2021 season with a 22-1 overall record.

Gael Spike -- In an exciting five-set match, Shelton comes from behind to defeat Cheshire, 3-2 (21-25, 17-25, 25-11, 25-17, 15-10) to win the 2022 SCC boys volleyball title on May 27. It was the Gaels' first league title since 2017.

Shark Attack -- Sacred Heart Academy wins the SCC girls basketball title with a 55-37 victory over second-seeded Daniel Hand on Feb. 23. The Sharks then proceed to win the Class MM state girls basketball title, holding off St. Joseph, 52-50, on March 20. The Sharks finished the season with a 26-1 final record.



Notre Dame boys ice hockey

Green Knights Puck -- Notre Dame boys ice hockey team defeats Xavier, 5-0, to win the SCC Division I title on March 4. Two weeks later, the Green Knights come-from-behind to defeat Darien, 4-2, to win the state championship and the number-one ranking in Connecticut. ND finished the 2021-22 season with a final 20-4 record.

No Messing Around on the Mat -- Xavier wins 10-of-14 weight classes to roll to the SCC wrestling title totaling a meet-record 264 points. The Falcons then proceed to win the Class L and State Open titles becoming the second SCC team (Xavier in 2012) to win both titles.

Yellowjackets Sting -- East Haven wins its first SCC softball title on May 25, defeating second-seeded Jonathan Law, 6-1, behind a masterful pitching effort from league Player of Year Emilee Bishop.

A Vision Quest -- After earning a second-place finish at the SCC Championships on Feb. 5, the Branford wrestling team won its first-ever state title (Class M) on Feb. 19.

Six-Peat -- Fairfield Prep won its sixth straight SCC boys lacrosse title on May 26 with a 13-6 victory over second-seeded Cheshire.

Lady Titans Like the Outdoors -- Sheehan girls outdoor track wins its second consecutive SCC title, outpointing runner-up Shelton by 60 points (141 to 81). The Titans then go on to win the Class M and State Open titles.

Amity Links -- Medalist Ava Gross leads Amity Regional to the SCC girls golf title on June 2 at Oronoque Country Club. The Spartans captured their third league title and first since 2019.

Going on a Crusade -- After finishing 8-8 during the regular season, the 14th-seed Lauralton Hall girls lacrosse team wins four games to reach the Class S state finals before losing to New Fairfield.

Jesuit Revenge -- After dropping two games to Xavier in the regular-season, Fairfield Prep defeats the Falcons, 9-4, to win the SCC baseball championship. It was the Jesuits' second straight league title, and third in the last four seasons.

Prep Shoots Low -- Three Fairfield Prep golfers -- Charlie Duffy, Will Huntington and Mike Rothberg - shoot in the 70's as the Jesuits rolled to the SCC boys golf title on June 1 at The Farms Country Club. A week later, Fairfield Prep wins the Division I state title.



East Haven softball

Run, Falcons, Run -- Xavier placed six runners in the top 20 finishers, led by senior Eamon Burke who captured first-place for the second straight year, on its way to its sixth consecutive SCC boys cross country title. A week later, the Falcons cruised to the Class L state title and then finished second in the State Open on Nov. 5.

Amity Tennis Repeats - Amity Regional wins its second straight SCC girls tennis title, defeating eventual Class M state champion Guilford, 7-0, on May 24.

New Nickname, Same Title -- In an extremely competitive contest, North Haven came-from-behind to defeat Lyman Hall, 4-3, in the SCC Division II boys ice hockey championship game on March 5. It was the Nighthawks' second straight league title.

You Talking About Playoffs? -- Five SCC football teams earned state playoff berths in 2021. After having no 2020 season, three teams qualified in Class LL (Fairfield Prep, Shelton and Hamden), while Daniel Hand (L) and Branford (M) earned berths. It was Branford's first playoff berth since 2005.

Four-Peat -- Daniel Hand wins its fourth straight SCC boys tennis title, defeating second-seeded Fairfield Prep, 5-2.


Grizzlies Repeat -- Guilford girls lacrosse wins the SCC title for the third straight season, defeating Cheshire, 12-6, on May 26. Two weeks later, the Grizzlies win the Class M state title, prevailing 12-8 over St. Joseph.

Ram Spikes Way to Title -- Cheshire wins the SCC girls volleyball title, defeated long-time rival Amity Regional 3-1 (25-21, 25-17, 22-25, 25-19) on November 6. It is the Rams' league-best 15th SCC title, and its fourth in the last five seasons.

Indoor Titans -- After winning the SCC title, the Sheehan girls indoor track squad wins its first-ever state title, capturing the Class M title on Feb. 10. The Titans had won the SCC title four days earlier, outpointing the league runner-up by 54 points.

How Dramatic -- On Feb. 10, the Lyman Hall boys indoor team collected its first indoor track state title since 1995, winning in dramatic fashion. The Trojans jumped from fifth place to first in the team standings when Chance DeCrescenzo earned Lyman Hall's lone individual win of the night by taking the pole vault. Lyman Hall finished with 44 points, two up on SCC-rival Jonathan Law.

OT Goal Wins It -- Sofia Cuozzo's overtime goal lifted Guilford to a 4-3 victory over West Haven / Sacred Heart Academy in the SCC girls ice hockey championship game on Feb. 25.



This past winter, she served as a captain and was a key part of the team's second-place finish at the Class L state championship meet. An honor roll student, she was the recipient of the team's Sportsmanship award. Maxine will attend Endicott College in the fall with plans to major in criminal justice.

JASON RABA, Cheshire HS (football/lacrosse)

A two-sport standout for the Rams, Jason suffered a season-ending posterior hip dislocation in October 2021 while making a tackle from his defensive end position. He was diagnosed with gluteus medius tearing and bone bruising secondary to the dislocation. After a period of non-weight bearing, Jason began therapy to regain his range of motion. Although he was not able to return to the playing field for the during football season, he stepped up as a leader off the turf to support his teammates. After more than two months of rehab, he returned to lacrosse workouts in preparation for the spring season. Jason earned All-SCC Second Team honors for his outstanding play at the attack position this spring and has led the Rams to a SCC championship and Class M semifinal berth. Jason will play lacrosse at St. John's University next year and intends to major in business.


