

All Hail The Alliance!

Once again, the SCC was part of the Connecticut High School Football Alliance, a collection of six leagues that schedule competitive non-league contests. Alliance teams won all six state titles in the 2023 season; including two by SCC teams (North Haven and Daniel Hand).

During the regular-season, SCC teams recorded a 19-21 overall record in Alliance games. Tier 1 teams recorded a 11-7 record, while Tier 2 was 3-6. Tier 3 teams


SCC member school teams have won 538 state championships since 1994-95 (169 fall,199 in winter, and 170 in the spring).
