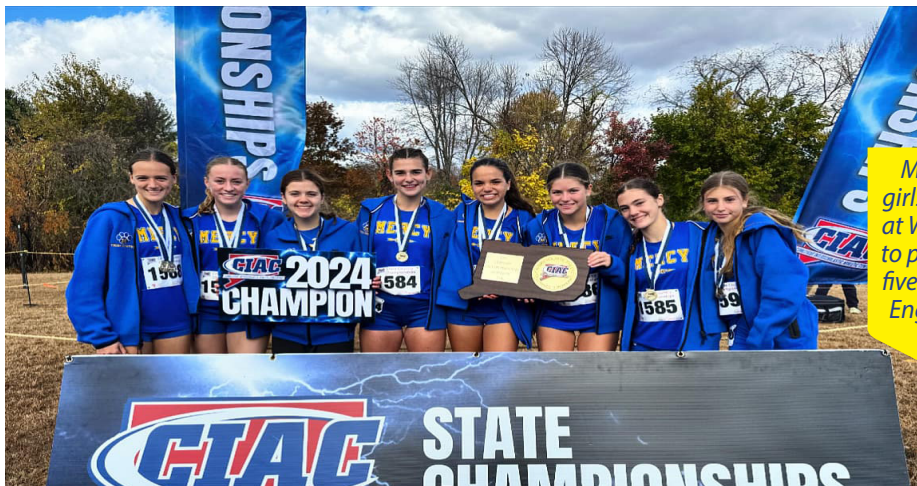

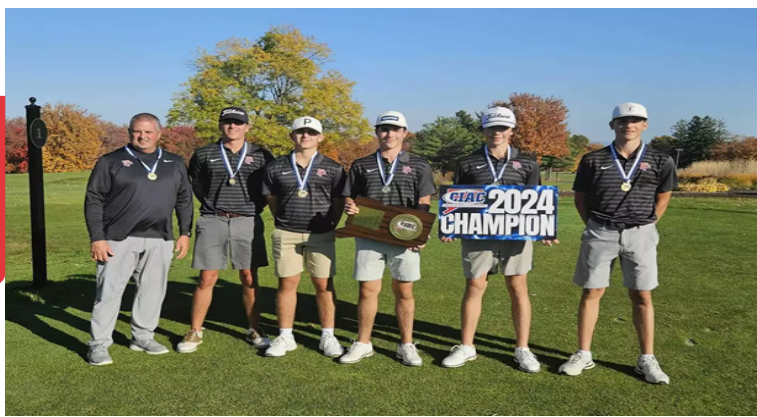
SCC member school teams have won 564 state championships since 1994-95 (175 fall, 209 in winter, and 180 in the spring).

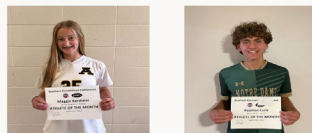
