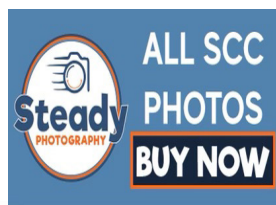

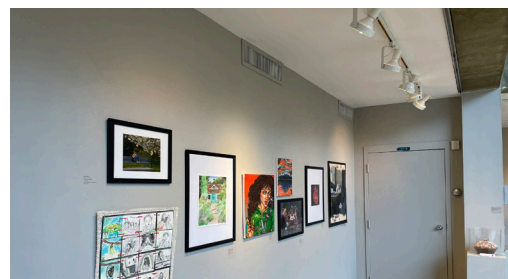

Town Fair Tire was the presenting sponsor of the SCC's "BEST OF... FOR 2024-25" an online poll to determine the best moment or performance in the Southern Connecticut Conference during the academic year. More than 1,600 votes were cast during the seven-day voting period.



THE WINNER:

THE LIONS ROAR; FORAN SOFTBALL SHINES IN 2025

Foran won the SCC and Class M state softball titles in 2025. The Lions, who finished the regular season with a 20-0 record but were the tournaments #2 seed, defeated eventual Class LL state champion Cheshire in the SCC title game on May 29, 2-1. It was the Lions' first SCC title since 2012. More impressively, Foran would go and secure a perfect 28-0 season with a 1-0, 13-inning victory over Woodland on Sunday, June 15. Junior pitcher Abby Corris had 32 strikeouts in the state title game – it was the Lions' first state title since 2011.

MORE TOP SCC MOMENTS FROM 2024-25...

FALL

For the Green... Fight! Fight! -- The Notre Dame boys soccer team wins its first-ever SCC title, defeating Xavier, 3-0, on Oct. 28. The Green Knights allowed just one goal in three SCC playoff games.

Mercy, Mercy, Mercy! -- Two weeks after capturing its third straight SCC title, Mercy culminates the 2024 season with a 2-1 last-season victory over St. Joseph in the Class LL state final. Molly Benson scored the game-winner in the closing seconds on an assist from her sister Kaylee to seal the Tigers' second state title in three seasons.

Grizzlies were Great! -- Guilford captures the SCC field hockey title – its first league title since 2021. Two week later, Cassie Ward's goal in the second overtime lifted the Grizzlies past SCC-rival Branford to the Class M state championship.

Fast Tigers -- After winning its first SCC title in 11 years, the Mercy girls cross country team captures the Class M state title on October 26 and proceeds to finish second at the State Open meet a week later.

SCC'S BEST OF.... 2024-25 - CONTINUED



Hand Gridders Reign -- Daniel Hand captures its first-ever SCC football regular-season title. The Tigers finished a perfect 8-0 against league competition, and 11-1 overall which included victories over eventual state playoff participants Fairfield Prep, New London and Berlin.

Jesuits Go Low --- Fairfield Prep golf won its second straight "fall" state championship. The Jesuits (301) defeated runner-up Conard six strokes, and were led by Caden Piselli (70) and Robby Rosati (71) at Chippanee GC.

X-Men Keep Running Fast -- Xavier cross country won the SCC title for the ninth straight time and captured its sixth consecutive Class L title a week later. The Falcons then finished fifth at the State Open and qualified for the New England Championships for the eighth consecutive year - the longest active New England streak for any Connecticut boys cross country program.

WINTER

Jesuits Pool Success --- The Fairfield Prep boys swimming continued its dominance in the pool, winning its fourth consecutive and 20th overall SCC title, and then proceeded to win the Class L state title. It was the first state title won by a SCC team since 2011-12.

Green Knights Repeat --- Led the SCC and state player of the year Abdou Toure, the Notre Dame boys basketball team captured its second straight Division I state title on March 17 with a 68-55 victory over St. Bernard. Two weeks earlier, the Green Knights captured their fourth straight SCC title, defeating Hillhouse, 62-44, in the final at a sold-out M&T Bank Arena.

Selena on the Mat -- Jonathan Law sophomore Selena Batres wrestler earns All-New England honors (finishing third in the 107-pound weight class). For the season, she finished 20-0 in matches against girls from the state of Connecticut and 24-2 overall. Batres was a fourth-place finisher at the SCC boys championship meet on Feb. 15.



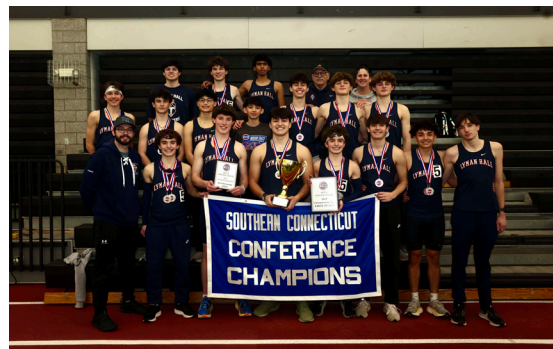

Ice Sharks -- Behind SCC player of the year Alessandra Picard, the West Haven/Sacred Heart Academy girls ice hockey co-op captured the SCC title with an exciting 2-1 victory over The Blades (Amity Regional/Cheshire/North Haven) on March 1.

Success on the Ice -- Behind the SCC Division II player of the Year Lorenzo DeFilio (who attends SCC member school Sheehan), the East Haven boys ice hockey co-op captured the Division II state title with a 7-3 victory over SCC-rival Cheshire. It was the second straight year the two teams met in the state final. It was East Haven's first state title since 1998.

X-Men Grapplers -- Xavier wins its eighth consecutive SCC wrestling title winning a 94-point margin on Feb. 15. The Falcons would then go on to win their fifth straight Class L championship and fourth consecutive State Open title before finishing second at the New England meet on March 9.

Trojans Track -- Behind SCC athlete of the year Owen Rich, the Lyman Hall indoor track team captures its first-ever SCC title, and proceeded to win the Class M and State Open titles. The Trojans became the fifth SCC indoor track team (and first since 2014-15) to win both a class meet and State Open title in the same year.

Tigers Terrific on the Mat -- Daniel Hand's gymnastics team, led by Brooke Anderson, wins the SCC title for the fourth straight year and 25th time in 29 years -- winning by 20.1 points over runner-up Jonathan Law. Two weeks later, the Tigers captured the Class S state title (by just 0.90 points) over runner-up Killingly.

Sharks Hoop Success --- After winning the SCC title, the Sacred Heart Academy girls basketball team returned to the state title game for the third time in the last four seasons. The Sharks defeated SCC rivals Hamden and Mercy, along with Conard and Southington (57-47) from the CCC to capture the Class LL state title on March 16 at Mohegan Sun Arena.

Titans Rejoice -- One year after falling in the state final, the Sheehan girls basketball team returns to Mohegan Sun Arena and captures the program's first state title (since 1976), defeating East Catholic, 56-51, on March 16.

Cheer for the Nighthawks -- After sharing the SCC crown with East Haven at the SCC competition, the North Haven competitive cheer-leading team won first place at the State Open competition on March 8.

SPRING

Rams Rejoice -- After finishing as the SCC runner-up, Cheshire captured the Class LL softball state title, defeating Ridgefield, 2-0, on June 15. Led by SCC Player of the Year junior pitcher Jenica Matos, Cheshire allowed just three runs in four state tournament games. It was the Rams' first state title since 2016.

Trojans Triumph -- Lyman Hall baseball wins its first-ever SCC baseball title on May 29, defeating Amity Regional, 5-2, in nine innings. Two week later, the Trojans captured the Class L state title with a 3-0 win over SCC-rival Guilford. Lyman Hall would finish as the number-one team in the final state polls.

Third Time is a Charm -- After losing twice to the Tigers in the regular-season and SCC playoffs, Guilford defeats SCC-rival Daniel Hand, 12-11, in the Class M state boys lacrosse championship game on June 14. It is the Grizzlies' first-ever state title.

Lax Crusade! -- Lauralton Hall defeats league-rival Sacred Heart Academy, 18-11, in the Class S girls lacrosse state title game on June 15. It is the Crusaders' second straight state title.

Tigers Times Two -- On June 4, the Daniel Hand boys and girls tennis teams capture state titles in convincing fashion. The boys defeat Avon, 5-2, and the girls prevail against Suffield, 6-1. It is the first time in the SCC's 31-year history that one school won state titles in both genders during the same year.

Prep on the Hardcourts -- In a highly competitive match, Fairfield Prep won the SCC boys tennis title on May 28, defeating Amity Regional, 4-3. It is the Jesuits' third straight league title and their seventh overall.

House Rules -- A week after earning runner-up status at the SCC championship meet, the Hillhouse girls outdoor track & field squad captures the Class MM state title on June 3. The state title is Academics' head coach Gary Moore 50th of his career. The Academics also captured the Class M indoor title during the winter.

Brotherly Love --- North Haven brothers Will and James Sagnella both shot 3-under-par 69s to share medalist laurels at the CIAC Boys State Open at the Mohegan Sun Golf Course on June 13. Two weeks earlier, Will and James also earned All-SCC honors leading the Nighthawks to a runner-up finish.

Haley, Haley -- Amity Regional senior Haley Mario wins SCC Player of the Year in both girls volleyball and girls lacrosse during 2024-25, leading the Spartans to SCC titles in both sports. Behind Mario's five goals, the Spartans won their second consecutive girls lacrosse league title in 2025, defeating Branford, 13-9, on May 29.

SCC's BEST OF.... 2024-25 - CONTINUED



Dominating -- Cheshire's Julia Paek led the Cheshire Rams to the 2025 SCC girls golf title on May 29, shooting a 76. Two weeks later, she earned medalist honors at the Division II state meet. She then repeated as the State Open medalist, shooting a two-under 68 at Mohegan Sun Golf Course on June 13.

Gael Spikers --- Before an enthusiastic crowd, the Shelton boys volleyball team captured the SCC title on May 30, defeating long-time rival Cheshire, 3-1. It was the Gaels' eighth league title.

Maya Throws Far -- Sacred Heart Academy's Maya Quaranta, who also was the valedictorian of her class and off to Yale in the fall, wins the SCC, Class M, State Open and New England outdoor track titles in the shot put, and adds record-breaking tosses in the discus and hammer throw during the spring season. Maya was both the SCC indoor and outdoor track athlete of the year.

SCC Rules Boys Tennis State Open -- On June 12, SCC Player of the Year and Notre Dame junior Michael Lorenzetti captured the CIAC State Open boys tennis singles title beating top seed Jackson Mountford (New Canaan) in straight sets 6-4, 7-6. Fairfield Prep's Andrew Beckerlegge and Anduin Thung won the doubles title (6-1, 6-2) over top-seeded duo from Greenwich High School.

Cheshire Goes Low -- Cheshire won the 2025 SCC boys golf title based on a new league tie-breaker. The team with the lowest combined score (top four scoring players on each team) on the course's number one handicap hole (Farms Country Club, hole #7). Cheshire was -1 on the hole, North Haven was even par. For the tournament, the Rams had four players shoot in the 70s on their way to a league championship record 301 score.

Number 1! Number 1! Number 1!

After having a record six teams finish as the #1 team in the state in 2023-24, the SCC had five teams earn the state's respective top honors during 2024-25.

Girls Soccer: Mercy was No. 1 in the final Class LL/L poll after winning the CIAC Class LL championship over defending champion and top seed St. Joseph-Trumbull 2-1 on a last-second shot from Molly Benson. Mercy was the only Connecticut team ranked nationally, placing eighth in the United Soccer national poll.

Boys Basketball: Notre Dame (25-2), under the direction of head coach Jason Shea, won the Division I state boys basketball title on March 15 with a 68-55 victory over St. Bernard behind 27 points and 20 rebounds from SCC Player of the Year Abdou Toure. It was ND's second straight state title. The Green Knights also won their fourth straight SCC title on Feb. 26.

Girls Basketball: Sacred Heart Academy (25-2), led by head coach Jason Kirck, won the Class LL girls basketball state title on March 14 with a 57-47 victory over Southington, led by SCC Player of the Year Emily Mennillo (16 points and 10 rebounds). It was the Sharks' second state title in four seasons.

Wrestling: The Xavier wrestling team captured the SCC, Class L and State Open titles in 2025, finish as the top team in the the state for the fourth straight year. Head coach Mike Cunningham's Falcons also finished second at the New England to conclude an outstanding season.

Baseball: Under the direction of head coach Billy Rich, the Trojans won their first-ever SCC title -- defeating Amity Regional, 5-2, in nine innings on May 29. Lyman Hall then went on a masterful state tournament run, outscoring opponents, 39-8, to win the Class L state title and finish as the number-one team in the state. The Trojans (25-3) defeated SCC-rivals Cheshire (3-2 in the semifinals on June 11) and Guilford (3-0 in the title game on June 14) to earn their first state championship since 2002.
